There will be a meeting of the ICS Board at the end of March to make the final decisions and finalise the conference programme and schedule. *Regarding future events, I am delighted to announce that Compumag 2021 will be held in Cancun, Mexico, in the International Convention Centre (Cancun ICC). The dates will be from the 19th to 22nd July 2021. All details and further information will be provided in due course, but you may wish to pencil in the dates now in your diary!*

*The 2023 event should take place somewhere in Asia, Australasia or Oceania. The invitation to bid is now formally open, see the details on the front page and the relevant rules and regulations on page 14 of this Newsletter. It is expected that bids will be submitted before summer and the final decision made at the meeting of the Board during Compumag Paris.*

*Finally, the elections to the Board of the Society will be held over summer and the results announced in the autumn. In accordance with our Constitution, about half of the members of the Board retire every three years and elections are held. The retiring members are eligible for re-election. The slate of the candidates for each region will be prepared by the Nominating Committee. Following our tradition I will publish the names of all candidates and their short bios in the next issue of the Newsletter.*

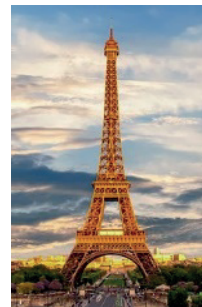

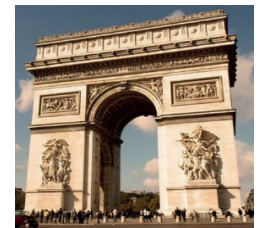


### Welcome to COMPUMAG 2019

### Invitation to bid for COMPUMAG 2023

In accordance with the conference tradition and Society's Bye-Laws, a formal invitation to bid to organise the COMPUMAG conference in 2023 is hereby issued. Interested groups and institutions are invited to first communicate to the Secretary an intention to submit and then prepare the bid in accordance with Article VII of the Bye-Laws and following the guidelines. Both the extract from the Bye-Laws and the Guidelines are published on page 14 of this newsletter. All bids must be submitted a month before COMPUMAG Paris, that is by 15<sup>th</sup> June 2019. With the 2019 meeting taking place in France and the 2021 event going to Cancun, Mexico, the preferred venue for 2023 would be in Asia, Australasia or Oceania. It is anticipated that the decision about the conference venue and which group is awarded the organisation will be made at the conference in Paris.
