Bill was a real giant in the field of computational electromagnetics and his tremendous contributions are exemplified not only by his books and papers, but mainly by his leadership. He created the Compumag series of conferences, still going strong after well over 40 years, as well as the CEFC series (now an IEEE conference). In early 90s he had a vision of setting up the International Compumag Society, now into 27th year of existence, and was its first President. Thousands of researchers around the world would have used the suite of software Opera, originally developed by the company Bill formed in the early 80s, then known as Vector Fields. His the discipline cannot be overestimated. Bill attended many conferences, gave numerous invited talks around the world, visited several research and industrial institutions, was by far the most influential and known member of our community. 
